Being Daring

- Cold messaging is effective if you have intention
 - Whether it is having genuine interest of learning more about someone's personal journey or seeing them as someone that can help you achieve your goals
 - When messaging them, **point out something that made you interested in talking to them** whether it be a post they posted **you resonated with, share similar interests, etc**
- Schedule 20-30 minute informal coffee-chats with a plan
 - What do you want to get out of the coffee chat?
 - Informal Mentorship
 - Professional or Personal Advice
 - Aside from asking how *they* can help *you*, ask how *you* can help *them*
 - Thank them for their time
- Most important question to ask in the end: who should I talk to next?
 - Personal story how I landed my first product management internship through coffee chats

Networking with Purpose

- A career fair is a great way to network with like-minded peers, recruiters, and get a glimpse of what an industry is like
- With so many people, how do you stand out from the crowd?
 - A personal story from college and my first internship. What did I do different? Challenge the status quo.
 - Being genuine and taking the effort to make these relationships and connections with others.
- Making yourself stand out and building relationships
 - Relationship Piggy Bank
 - Follow up with purpose, **be actionable**
 - Being resourceful with school and events
 - From the recruiting side, stories about candidates that stood out to me, what recruiters look for

Opportunities in School

- Everyone says you should get involved, but how do you get involved with something?
 - Join a community you are interested in learning something new or recreational
 - o Being able to teach others goes a long way, especially TAing classes you enjoyed
- During my sophomore and junior year, I became a TA for my university's Intro to CS course (CS124) and it helped me:
 - Be able to explain abstract concepts in simple terms
 - Develop leadership skills by taking initiatives to improve the course experience from suggestions made by students and course staff
 - Build meaningful relationships with my professor and other TAs that initially started with a Course Staff Discord channel for weekly game nights that grew into a community that helped me navigate both academically and professionally
